MGDA 2020 President Address

Welcome everyone to the first virtual Annual General Meeting of the MGDA. A different approach in what has been a very different year.

In spite of the challenges and restrictions imposed on everyone we managed to have a successful and profitable year. Thanks to everyone who chaired and worked on the event committees to achieve these successes, next year please volunteer to participate on a committee, its work but it's rewarding. While the Canadian National Open we were scheduled to host and our spring field trial were cancelled we did run all other scheduled events and all were profitable thanks to the many volunteers who came out to help as gunners and throwers. While the fall trial made a good profit thanks to the many entries from pro trainers, the importance of having volunteers was highlighted in that \$800 was spent hiring gunners, money that could have gone to improving the bottom line. The "Fill the Bar" fundraising event in lieu of selling Grey Cup tickets gave our coffers a boost, thanks to Matt Mutcheson and Crystal Fulton for organizing and running the event.

We held three work parties that were well attended and much grounds maintenance was accomplished such as refurbishing the picnic tables, brush clearing, burning, filling road potholes cleaning and sanitizing the clubhouse and toilets as well as yard cleanup including moving the tables into storage at the end of the season. My only regret is that we couldn't host a barbeque after each due to social gathering rules. Thanks to everyone who pitched in to help, your participation is what helps make our club the success it is today. It was very refreshing to have such good turnouts at the work parties. If the Canadian National Open proceeds next year we will need lots of help and it's a great experience to participate in hosting this prestigious week-long event. Lots of work but the upside is it's rewarding, enjoyable and can make a lot of money for the club so we can continue improving our facility.

We were able to continue the grounds development started last year and have seen a big improvement to the north end of the technical pond opening up more water with the removal of tules as well as digging a swim-by pond. A final dig to clear up the mud flats is scheduled for next spring. The foxtail mitigation project got a good start this fall until equipment breakdowns brought it to a halt but we will be able to evaluate the effectiveness next year and modify our methods used as required. Thanks go to Dewayne Hay, Colin McMichael, Geoff Plouffe and Murry Milne for their many trips to the grounds for the foxtail work and in planning, hiring a contractor and monitoring his work, this was done by all of them on their own time and expense. Our grounds are the envy of just about everyone I've met from other clubs especially those from the east where they have to beg landowners for access to property to run their trials. We are very fortunate to have what we have thanks to the foresight of previous members over the past decades and I look forward to grounds development continuing to make them even better. A special thanks also to Murry for all the mowing he has done for the past many years, not any easy job over the rough terrain. Did you know Murry always took a week of his vacation to ensure the mowing got done in time for the trialing season? Happy retirement from mowing Murray your back will thank you.

We all owe our thanks to the members of the board whose wide range of experience and input I am very grateful for. They dealt with the pandemic's challenges while still being able to see that we could run most of our events by arranging judges, getting grounds maintenance and development done. Special thanks to Secretary Carrie Whenham and Treasurer Helen Hasiuk for documenting meetings and keeping finances in order.

In closing I implore each of you to get involved in some way for the betterment of the club by participating on the executive board, helping at trials and tests, work parties and next year's National. It's participation by members that makes us a cohesive club, don't stand by and just enjoy the benefits of other's work. You will get to better know other members and find all are willing to help you train your dogs. We have a great facility and in the future you'll be able to look back and say you were part of its success. To future trial/test chairpersons I encourage you to avoid expenses by soliciting volunteer help and for everyone to do what's in the best interest of the club. 2020 Grounds Report

As usual, a lot of work was accomplished to keep our grounds looking pristine.

We had a couple of work parties doing cleanup etc and the turnout was much appreciated.

There has been considerable commentary both this and last by the Executive as well as some members suggesting that we have to do a much better job of cutting, digging, and more permanent removal of tullies, opening up new training/trial areas etc as well as general grounds maintenance and its finally finished at least for this year.

It's worthy to note that as a result of removing the tullies on the west side off the causeway and the low water, there are now several areas with exposed mud which can hurt both dogs and handlers.

In the next month our contractor will be doing some cleanup and mud removal to made the worst of these areas safer.

Although major work has been done on digging, opening up new areas etc more needs to take place particularly in light of the upcoming National, and our budget but that will be up to the 2021 Executive.

What was completed?

- Completion of digging on west side causeway
- Additional brush removal north east corner, west side
- Tullie cutting on technical pond area and far south corner, west side.
- Top soil and seed new eastside mound and 2 island pond was not done.
- Spraying of foxtail was completed on east side only due to equip issues.
- Miscellaneous items included
 - Levelling of the equip trailer
 - Outhouse door
 - Additional security cameras
 - Levelling of the patio area and new gravel
 - Some pothole repair
 - The usual great job of grass cutting
 - Cleaning and sanitizing of outhouses before each trial

We have in accordance with Article IX, Section 2, of the MGDA Bylaws, audited the Treasurer's report/ bookkeeping and records for the period ending October 31 2020. In our opinion the Financial Statements present fairly and accurately the financial position of the MGDA as of October 31, 2020.

Observation:

It was noted that the MGDA reserve fund had been accessed to support events (likely due to the 2020 Pandemic), as opposed to what was done in previous years whereby the reserve, was held in a separate account which was, not to be used for operating expenses.

Recommendation:

1. That event committees (Field Trial, Hunt Test, and Working Certificate) submit an operating budget to the executive for approval, 60 days prior to the event being held.
2. That the MGDA executive establish a separate account such as term deposit, which would not be easily accessible and would be the exclusive repository for the reserve fund.

Proposed Wording Change to the MGDA Constitution

Current Wording –

Membership

Section 1– A member of the Association shall be anyone interested in the promotion of the work of the Association and whose application and or dues have been received and accepted.

Section 2– In order to be eligible for membership in the Association a person must be at least eighteen (18) years of age at the date of making the application for membership.

Proposed Wording -

In order to be eligible for membership in the Association a person must be at least eighteen (18) years of age at the date of making the application, **except where the applicant is requesting admission as a Junior Member.**

A Junior Member is one who has (one or more family members who are active adult members and/or is sponsored by an active adult member and who is between the ages of 12 - 17). Junior members can participate actively in the promotion, operation and endeavors of the Association but may not vote. Junior members between the age of 12 - 17 must be accompanied by an active adult or active adult spousal member while on the grounds. Membership of a Junior member will be the same as an associate membership.

It is important to note that further changes once the proposed wording is approved will be required to the constitution, for consistency with the rest of the constitution defining membership types, an update is required in the section defining membership as it states there are 6 classes of membership and lists them "a" through "f" but then numbers them with their definitions. It now needs to state there are 7 classes of membership and the definition of the new Junior Membership category needs to be listed as item "g". Then insert the definition of a junior member as Section 9 (following the definition of a spousal member) and renumber the rest of the points in that section accordingly.
